Youth Empowerment Clubs

This week the Career Network Support team at CDI and KITE DSM are excited to have completed a brand-new curriculum for the Youth Empowerment Clubs!

The clubs, contrastingly to the Think Big Challenge, are designed to run in schools all year round, giving students a regular opportunity to develop their soft employability skills.

We have redesigned the curriculum to allow students to autonomously run the clubs, independent of KITE DSM and CDI.

This new curriculum is planned to be distributed not only to the existent clubs within Dar es Salaam, but also to a new set of clubs to be set up in local schools this week!

The curriculum will have a massive effect upon the sustainability of the clubs. Now even though CDI members will leave at the end of the summer, and KITE DSM Volunteers may graduate or move on, the clubs will independently continue to provide students with the skills they need for years to come.
